Ages: Applicants must be 14 or older unless accompanied by an adult guardian

Cost: \$1500.00 per person

Cost includes: Transportation from major airports, Lodging, Meals, Ministry Expenses, Trip Insurance

Other costs not included: Passport, vaccinations, spending money, etc...

Payment Schedule:

February 1st – early application deadline with non-refundable \$200 deposit

March 1st – late application deadline with \$500 due (\$300 if deposit already paid)

May 1st – \$500 due

June 1st – total remaining balance due (\$500)

Travel: The Trip cost includes travel from the airport nearest you (you may be asked to choose a different airport if the cost is exorbitant from your local airport).

FUNDRAISING

You will be responsible for the raising of your own funds for the Mexico Mission Project. In our meetings we will discuss ways to raise funds, but the best way is to write a heartfelt letter to your friends and family explaining why you believe God is calling you to go to the Philippines.

Flight Information

Packing:

1. When you are packing you should remember to pack one suitcase for you
2. Put your name and address on the inside and outside of your suitcases.
3. Carry-on Information:
 - Everyone is allowed one carry-on.
 - Include: one day's worth of clothes, medicine, valuables, and other necessary items.
 - Cannot exceed 40 pounds or 45 linear inches.
 - No metal knives, box cutters, straight razors.
 - Liquid, Gels, Aerosols: Place all liquid containers in a separate clear plastic, quart size zip-top bag.
4. Individual liquid containers should be no larger than 3.4 ounces.
5. Checked Baggage Information:
 - Everyone is allowed one checked suitcase.
 - Your luggage cannot exceed 50 pounds per suitcase.
 - Remove straps and protruding objects from bags before checking them.
 - Do not lock suitcases due to screening of every checked bag.
 - Spare lithium batteries must be in carry-on with terminals covered/insulated.
 - Items in checked baggage are limited to a total of no more than 70 ounces per passenger.
 - Contents of each container may not exceed 16 fluid ounces.
6. Personal Item Information:
 - Everyone is allowed one personal item (purse, briefcase, laptop, small book bag style backpack, small tote bag, or shoulder bag not to exceed 36 linear inches.
8. Miscellaneous Information:
 - Please do not joke with the airlines/customs officials.
 - Answer them yes sir or ma'am.
 - They take their jobs seriously and you do not want to spend your week with them.

Mexico Mission Trip Rules

1. You shall not forget that you represent the Lord Jesus Christ.
2. You shall not expect that things will be the same as they are at home.
3. You shall not take minor things too seriously.
4. You shall not let other group members get on your nerves.
5. You shall not worry. Few things people worry about are ever fatal.
6. Remember your passport. A person without documents is a person without a country.
7. Blessed is the person who says "thank you" in any language.
8. When in the Mexico do as the Mexicans do.
9. Remember, you are a guest in Mexico. He who treats his host with respect shall be treated as a honored guest.

While You Are in Mexico

1. Please love on as many people as possible.
2. Share the Gospel and your personal testimony while traveling to and from Mexico as well as while in country.
3. Please journal each night because by the end of the week you may forget details of your experiences that you would like to remember.
4. Be careful not to make commitments to help people that you do not plan on following through with when you return home.
5. Please check with a trip leader before giving a gift of any kind to anyone.
6. Learn a few Spanish words and phrases. You will be amazed at how this will break down barriers.
7. Get to know your team. Especially those team members that you do not know well.
8. Please drink a lot of the purified bottled water.
9. Do not drink or brush your teeth with the tap water.
10. Be on time. When you are late it makes the rest of the team wait on you.
11. Be kind when you are taking pictures. It is always best to ask before taking a picture.
12. If someone asks you for anything please check with a staff member for advice.
13. Remember not to be exclusive in your relationship(s) while in Mexico. If your boyfriend/girlfriend/spouse is on the team, then make every effort to interact with the entire team.
14. The food is very good and is safe to eat so please eat enough so you will stay healthy.
15. Remember that spiritual warfare is very real. Do not neglect your personal quiet time.

Tips For Returning Home

1. Don't expect too much from other people who did not go on the trip. Chances are they won't be as excited as you are about Mexico.
2. When people ask about your trip, share briefly.
3. Try to stay in touch with some people from your team.
4. Please contact those people that prayed for you and supported your trip financially.
5. Develop some realistic goals for yourself when you return back home.
6. Don't bore people with your pictures or videos. Allow them to ask you for information about your trip.
7. You cannot take any food, live plants, or animals back home with you.
8. Allow God to further develop your Christian worldview as you return to the U.S.
